Dr Min completed his physician training at a number of Queensland hospitals including Princess Alexandra Hospital, Greenslopes Private Hospital, Gold Coast University Hospital and Logan hospital. Dr Min is a lecturer at the School of Medicine, University of Queensland. He also is a supervisor of the specialist physician trainees at the Royal Australasian

College of Physicians.

Dr Min is an active member of the Australian Endocrine Society, Australian Diabetes Association and the American Endocrine Society. He regularly attends Endocrinology meetings and conferences at both local and international levels to keep his knowledge up-to-date so that he can deliver the best evidence based care. He has presented his research topics and cases at a number of local and national conferences.

Dr Min has fellowships in both Endocrinology and General Medicine. He has expertise in diabetes and general Endocrine disorders including thyroid, pituitary, adrenal disorders, metabolic bone diseases and testosterone insufficiency. Dr Min is also a staff specialist at Ipswich General Hospital.

Natalie is a Gastroenterologist in Brisbane and provides services in general gastroenterology, endoscopy, colonoscopy and 24 hour oesophageal pH monitoring. Natalie has special interests in inflammatory bowel disease and functional gastrointestinal disorders such as dysphagia, dyspepsia, IBS, constipation and diarrhoea. Natalie is a Visiting Medical Officer at St

Andrew's War Memorial Hospital. She also has a public appointment as a staff specialist consultant gastroenterologist at the Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee Hospital in south-west Brisbane.

Natalie obtained her Bachelor of Medicine and Surgery degree at the University of Queensland in Brisbane in 2005. Prior to this, she completed a Bachelor of Science degree, majoring in biomedical science. Natalie completed physician training at the Gold Coast and Princess Alexandra Hospitals before undertaking advanced Gastroenterology training at the Nambour and Royal Brisbane Hospitals.

In her final year of training, Natalie worked as the IBD and Motility Fellow at the Princess Alexandra Hospital. She was awarded her Fellowship to the Royal Australasian College of Physicians and subsequently completed a clinical observership in functional gastrointestinal disorders in Melbourne. Natalie is commencing private practice at St Andrew's Ipswich Private Hospital from Lower Cameron House Sessional Rooms on Wednesday 6th July.

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Radiofrequency Ablation with Dr Maged Aziz

Dr Maged Aziz, Vascular Surgeon, performed St Andrew's first radiofrequency ablation procedure on Thursday 5th May. This procedure uses radiofrequency energy to precisely and effectively treat patients suffering from Chronic Venous Insufficiency (CVI) caused by varicose veins. This procedure is less painful and causes less bruising than alternative treatments. St Andrew's Ipswich is excited to be able to offer this procedure locally.
