

#### Dr Richard Nankervis Welcomes Endobronchial Ultrasound (EBUS) at St Andrew's Ipswich Private Hospital

Chest CT scans are now performed much more frequently for a variety of indications. They find an increasing number of expected and also incidental nodules or masses. Depending on background risk and likelihood of malignancy, a biopsy is usually required. The importance of tissue diagnosis remains key to treatment selection. The old mantra from oncology circles "Tissue is the issue" remains true today. Biopsy of course carries with it a degree of risk and the approach to biopsy should maximise success with minimal risk of complication. When lesions are central and within the airway, bronchoscopic biopsy under direct vision is usually performed. Sometimes central lesions are outside the airway making sampling impossible. These lesions will usually be too deep for CT guided fine needle aspiration. Alternatively, surgical sampling is quite invasive with degree of risk so should be undertaken with due consideration. Due to advances in miniaturisation of ultrasound technology



and advances in flexible optic fibre bronchoscopes, a combination "endobronchial ultrasound" was developed. It allows safe sampling of central extra-bronchial masses/



lymphnodes and more peripheral lesions without surgery. This is still a relatively new technique which until now has only been available in major centres. Recently the technique became available at St Andrew's Ipswich Private Hospital; allowing patients to undergo this procedure without having to travel to Brisbane for diagnosis.

Dr Richard Nankervis, Respiratory Physician, commented that EBUS is a day procedure; eliminating the need for inpatient stays. It is a safe and minimally invasive technique used to diagnose and stage tumours earlier which results in a better chance of cure.
